Thank you to all Committee Members who presented at the Open House! Our Guild is very busy and committed to our Mission. Please keep the various committees in mind throughout the year and see where your talents may be needed.

Challenge for 2025-26 carries the theme: **Through** My Window. Have some fun with this! Your final project could be a postcard, a potholder, a king-sized quilt, a tote bag or an I Spy quilt. Some members may wish to review photo collage techniques or photo printing onto fabric. Anything fitting the theme is fair game. The Challenge will be presented at the June 5th Luncheon.

SIGN UP for ALL workshops at the front table after the Business Meeting. Typically, the instructors give a class size limit. This number is given so that each participant is able to receive instruction and so that all have a satisfying experience. Often, supplies are ordered ahead of a class. The Guild requires a \$20 cash deposit when you sign up. It is returned when you attend the class. Other than special supplies recommended or required by the instructor, the Guild covers the cost of the workshops and trunk shows. Our goal is that all members who wish to participate in a workshop have the opportunity to do so whenever feasible. Calendar:

After the business meeting, Claire will guide us through a fun Tumbling Block Weaving *Workshop*. February 20th. *Round Robin*. We have a few instructors already, and we are looking forward to sharing the tricks and talents of the Guild members with the group. Please reach out to Darilyn or Jackie to sign up to demonstrate a 5-15 minute technique.

March 20th. Member-led Workshop. Our own Arminda will share a fun artistic fabric dyeing technique. Details will follow closer to the date.

April 17th. Community Service Sewing Day. Membership in attendance voted on sewing a Toiletry Bag as this year's project. The plan is that it would be filled by donated toiletries and distributed to local women's shelters.

May 8th. Quilted Vest/Jacket Workshop. Claire from Fern Valley Studio will teach a workshop guiding us through construction of a jacket or vest made from quilted material. In the coming months, keep an eye out for a suitable small quilt, old quilted bedspread, or quilted fabric that you may be willing to give a new life to. More details to follow, but a throw or twin-size piece should do the job. This will be a sewing machine workshop.

June 5th. Luncheon and Tricky Tray. Start collecting fabric, tools, patterns, UFOs (Un-Finished-Objects), threads and any quilting related items for the Tricky Tray. Collection and organization of donations takes place in the Spring. Lots of FUN!

Recipe!!

Member Nancy Coldreck's Gluten-Free/Low FODMAP Banana Bread

1/3 cup melted coconut oil

½ cup pure maple syrup

2 large eggs

2-3 Medium ripe bananas

1/4 cup unsweetened almond milk (I used Lactose free whole milk)

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup Bob's Red Mill 1:1 Gluten-Free Baking Flour (the blue bag)

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon fine salt

½ teaspoon cinnamon

½ cup chopped walnuts (optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease a bread loaf pan and set aside.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk together the melted coconut oil and maple syrup. Add the eggs and whisk. Then add mashed bananas, milk, and vanilla. Whisk until well combined.
- 3. In a large bowl, mix together the gluten-free flour, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon. Add the wet ingredients into the dry mixture and stir until mixed. Gently fold in the chopped
- 4. Pour batter into the greased loaf pan. Bake 55-60 minutes or until done. Allow the bread to cool begore slicing and serving.
