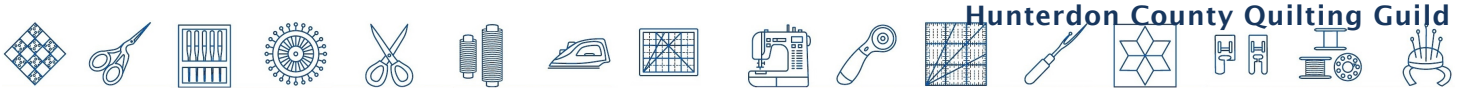

There were 49 members present at our December meeting. As always, advise me of any changes to your email, address or phone number. Thank you for remembering to wear your name badges and Guild pins each month!

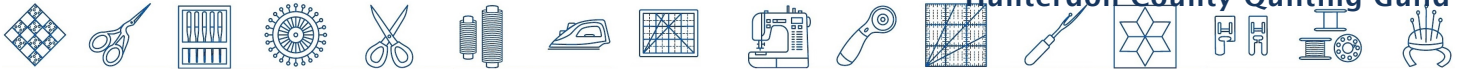

Please remember our quilting challenge for the year: ***A View Through My Window.***

January 16th (Friday) Business meeting at the usual time and location.

JAN 17 - (Saturday) ZOOM workshop with Quilt Maven Dave Dave Sirota will teach Collide O Scope on Zoom. David has recently provided an update to the prep work. Please follow [this link to his site](#) for pre-workshop prep details. Workshop participants will print the triangle template (from his website) at home onto regular copy paper and use it to cut lots of triangles of our fabric PRIOR to class. A few days before the workshop Dave will email the paper piecing patterns to the workshop participants. We will print those at home onto regular printer paper. David will show us how to use those during the class. Please review the materials list to be prepared for class. Dave had capped the class at 20, and graciously expanded to include a couple of extra participants. If you have paid your \$20 and signed up, you are all set.

February 20th. **Quilted Vest/Jacket Workshop.** Claire Whitehill of Fern Valley Studio is looking forward to our FEB 20 Quilted Jacket or Vest Workshop. We will be using the [Tamarack Jacket pattern](#) from Grainville Studio. The attendees for the quilt jacket workshop should purchase the pattern directly from Grainville. It can be ordered as a print-at-home, which comes via an easy,



shareable electronic link, or as a printed paper pattern which comes in the regular mail. Participants should prepare their paper patterns at home and then cut into the quilts at home OR cut at the workshop, whichever they are more comfortable with.

Look around your stash or your house for a quilt about twin size for a jacket, smaller for a vest. Pre-quilted fabric can be purchased if you wish. [See the general fabric recommendations here.](#) Contact Jackie Owens with any questions. More details will follow from Fern Valley for all who have signed up.

March 20th. **Member-led Workshop.** Our own Arminda will share a fun artistic fabric dyeing technique. Details will follow closer to the date.

April 17th. **Community Service Sewing Day.** Membership in attendance voted on sewing placemats as this year's project. More information will be coming at the January business meeting.

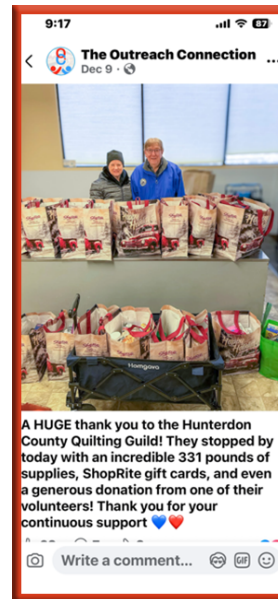
Spring Retreat, May 11-15, 2026
